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Law 74/2015 on the managers of alternative investment funds Art. 15 line

(3) AIFM shall at least make sure that:

c) the risk profile of the company corresponds to the size, portfolio structure and set investments strategies and objectives of EVERGENT Investments.

Art.23 line (2) For each AIF from the European Union it manages and for each AIF whose units it distributes in the European Union, AIFM should send FSA the following information:

c) *current risk profile* of AIF and risk management systems used by AIFM to manage market risk, liquidity risk, counterparty risk and other risks, including operational risks.

Regulation (EU) nr.231/2013 supplementing Directive 2011/61/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council as regards exemptions, general conditions for business, depositaries, leverage, transparency and supervision.

Art. 44. Risk Limits

(1) *AIFMS sets and applies quantitative, qualitative risk limits* or both for each AIF it manages, taking into account all relevant risks. Where only qualitative limits are set, the AIFM should be able to justify this approach before the competent authority.

(2) *Qualitative and quantitative risk limits* for each AIF cover at least the following risks:

a) market risks;

b) credit risks;

c) liquidity risks;

d) counterparty risks;

e) operational risks.

(3) On setting the risk limits, AIFM takes into account the strategies and assets used for each AIF it manages, as well as the national norms that apply to each of these AIFs. These *risk limits should correspond to the risk profile of* AIF as notified to investors, in accordance with article 23 line (4) letter c) EU Directive 2011/61 /UE and be approved by the management body.



Article 108 Regular notifications to investors

- (4) Notification of the *risk profile* of AIF, in accordance with art. 23 line (4) letter (c) of Directive 2011/61/UE presenting:
- (a) measures to assess the sensitivity of the AIF portfolio to the most relevant risks to

to which the AIF is or may be exposed;

(b) whether the risk limits set by the AIFM have been or are likely to be exceeded and, if these risk limits have been exceeded, a description of the circumstances and the corrective action taken.

This information shall be disclosed as part of the AIF's regular reporting to investors in accordance with its rules or instruments of incorporation, or at the same time as the prospectus and offering documents are made available and at least at the same time as the annual report is made available or published in accordance with Article 22(1) of Directive 2011/61/EU.

Article 40 Risk Management Policy

(2) The risk management policy must include the procedures necessary to allow AIFM to evaluate for each AIF it manages the exposure to market risk, liquidity risk and counterparty risk, as well as the AIFs' exposure to all other relevant risks that might have a significant impact for each managed AIF, including operational risks.

The Board of Directors sets the risk profile of EVERGENT Investments and ensures that the necessary measures are taken to fit the actual risks into the risk profile communicated to investors.

The risk profile represents all EVERGENT Investments' exposures to real and potential risks.

The risk profile is assessed at least once a year and as often as deemed necessary according to the risk matrix, based on the strategic objectives and, appropriately, the risk appetite. Its role is to determine the size of each relevant risk and the overall level of risk, based on relevant indicators.

For the proper monitoring of the relevant risks, in the context of compliance with EVERGENT Investments' regulatory framework, the following have been set for each relevant risk category:

• **Risk limits**. EVERGENT Investments has set quantitative risk limits for the relevant risks it is or could be exposed to, namely: *market risk, liquidity risk, sustainability risk, issuer risk, credit and counterparty risk and operational risk.*



To set risk limits relevant *indicators*¹ were used for each individual risk category. The risk limit for each relevant indicator is given by the *risk tolerance*, namely, the ability of EVERGENT Investments to accept or absorb that particular risk and *risk appetite*, namely the level up to which EVERGENT Investments is willing to undertake that particular risk.

In setting tolerance limits and risk appetites, the historical values recorded by EVERGENT Investments on the respective risk indicators were taken into account.

- **Risk tolerance** represents EVERGENT Investments' ability to accept or absorb risk. In EVERGENT Investments' view, keeping risks within the established tolerance margin constitutes a safety net in maintaining the level of risk appetite established at the strategic level. Risk tolerance, a tool for adjusting risk appetite, in terms of valuation levels/limits/value ranges, is expressed in the form of the evolution of risk indicators specific to each relevant risk category identified and assumed by EVERGENT Investments. Risk tolerance levels can be: high, medium, low.
- **Risk appetite**, represents the level of risk, expressed for each risk category, up to which EVERGENT Investments is willing to take risks, respectively to accept them, in accordance with the established investment strategy and policies, in the context of keeping the risks under control within the risk profile assumed for each risk category. The risk appetite expressed corresponds to the risk profile assumed by EVERGENT Investments. Risk appetite can be: high, medium, low.
- **Risk profile**, given the nature, size and complexity of EVERGENT Investments' activities.

Taking into account the investment policy and assets under management of EVERGENT Investments, *risk indicators, risk tolerance ranges, tolerance limits and risk appetite of EVERGENT Investments* have been established for the management of market risk, issuer risk, liquidity risk, sustainability risk, credit and counterparty risk and operational risk.

The risk indicators, tolerance limits and risk appetite for each risk are described in the operational risk management procedures.

The risk management function communicates on a quarterly basis to Executive Management and the Board of Directors updated information on the current level of risks to which EVERGENT Investments is exposed, as well as any existing or foreseeable breaches of established risk limits, to ensure that prompt and appropriate action can be taken.

EVERGENT Investments' Risk Profile

Based on historical and current values of risk indicators, tolerance limits and risk appetite set by the Board of Directors, the risk profile of EVERGENT Investments is as follows:

Risk type	Risk level
Market risk	Medium
Issuer risk	Medium
Liquidity risk	Low
Sustainability risk	Medium
Credit and counterparty risk	Medium
Operational risk	Medium
Overall risk profile	Medium

For each qualitative level of risk there is a corresponding quantitative level. For each risk indicator, risk management procedures determine its weight in the overall risk profile. The product of the weight of each risk and the quantitative level of risk appetite determines the quantitative value of that risk. The overall quantitative risk value is determined by summing the quantitative values of all risks.

The overall risk profile undertaken by EVERGENT Investments is a **medium** one, corresponding to a **medium risk appetite.**_

Information on the risk profile of EVERGENT Investments is disclosed as part of regular reporting to investors.

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
